

# New Submittal Requirements for Brevard County Development Permits

## New Submittal Requirements

As of May 1, 2003 construction sites that disturb one acre or greater of land are required to have coverage under the Generic Permit for Stormwater Discharge from Large and Small Construction Activities (DEP 62-621.300(4)(a)).

Sites one acre or greater must complete a Notice of Intent (NOI) (DEP form 62-621.300(4)(b)) to comply with FDEP National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II Construction Permit.

Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans (SWPPP) must be developed and implemented in order to comply with the NPDES Phase II Permit.

Two copies of the NOI and SWPPP must be submitted to Brevard County Land Development prior to construction.

## Requirements for SWPPP

The SWPPP shall be:

- completed prior to the submittal of the Notice of Intent (NOI) to be covered under the Department's Generic Permit for Stormwater Discharge from Large and Small Construction Activities.
  - amended whenever there is a change in design, construction, operation, or maintenance, which has a significant effect on the potential for discharge of pollutants to surface waters of the state or a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4).
  - amended if it proves to be ineffective in significantly reducing pollutants from sources identified in Part V.D.1. of the permit.
  - amended to indicate any new contractor and/or subcontractor that will implement any measure of the SWPPP. All amendments shall be signed, dated and kept as attachments to the original SWPPP.

## NOTICE

- DEP is the agency responsible for reviewing, processing and issuing NPDES permits.
- The NOI and the permit application fee must be submitted to DEP for issuance of the NPDES permit.
- The submittal of the NOI and SWPPP to Brevard County is required per Brevard County's MS4 NPDES permit and are not for review or approval. Compliance with County Code for site specific erosion and sediment control must continue to be reflected within the plan set.
- All changes to the SWPPP must be submitted to Brevard County whenever modifications are made to the document.
